

**CAMPING REGULATIONS****BEFORE COMING TO CAMP:**

1. All reservations for camp must be made and appropriate fees paid at the Council Service Center, and must be complete and finalized no later than 7 days prior to the camp-out.
2. Tour permit is required for all Out-of-Council units.

**AT CAMP:**

1. THE SCOUT OATH AND LAW, OUTDOOR CODE AND UNIT REGULATIONS ARE THE RULES OF CONDUCT WHILE AT CAMP
2. Check-in at the Camp Office upon arrival, with Ranger or Campmaster prior to 10 p.m.. Gate is closed at 10 p.m.
3. TWO ADULT LEADERS (one at least 21 years old) are required at all times.
4. Scout leaders will meet late arrivals in the parking lot.
5. Present your camp reservation form and roster of youth and adults to Ranger or Campmaster.
6. All vehicles are to be returned to the parking lot within 30 minutes after unloading.
7. Liquid fuels use by adults only may be used for cooking out-of-doors. No liquid fuel allowed in buildings.
8. RV camping is limited to the parking lot., no hook-ups allowed.
9. Build fires only in fire-pits. NEVER LEAVE A FIRE UNATTENDED.
10. Stay off private property. Our neighbors have a right to privacy
11. All garbage and trash must be taken home or placed in the camp dumpster. Dumpster lids must close completely.
12. Arrange for check-out inspection by the Campmaster or Ranger. Any group leaving without checking out will jeopardize their future use of camp and will be billed for clean-up work.
13. GROUPS WILL BE BILLED FOR DAMAGE.
14. In Cubbing, only registered Webelos may camp overnight. Cub Scouts and siblings may not camp over-night. National requires one adult to one Webelos ratio when camping.

**THINGS NOT ALLOWED IN CAMP:**

1. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES may be brought on the camp property.
2. Foot traffic only allowed in camp. (Bike must be walked in camp - no riding allowed)
3. Cutting or disfiguring of standing trees or shrubs is prohibited.
4. DO NOT interfere with other groups program or equipment.
5. DO NOT put garbage, trash or washwater in the latrines.
6. No pets are allowed on Council property.
7. Cub Scout camping, with the exception of Webelos, is not allowed.

**TENT CAMPING:**

1. Camp only in recognized campsites as assigned.
2. Do not ditch around tents or remove or rake ground cover.
3. Do not dig any holes.
4. Do not bring straw or conifers to camp.
5. NO FLAMES PERMITTED IN TENTS.
6. DO NOT LEAVE FIRES UNATTENDED.
7. Clean latrine, washstand and police site before check-out.

**CABINS:**

1. The approved capacity posted in each cabin may not be exceeded for sleeping. Overflow campers will be housed in tents.
2. Beds & mattresses are not to be removed from cabins.
3. No auxiliary heaters may be brought into buildings.
4. Mattresses are to be left on the beds.
5. Only one camper per bed.
6. Adult leaders must occupy sleeping quarters.
7. When ready to check-out, refer to "check-out" sheet posted in buildings.

**CO-ED CAMPING:**

1. All the above rules apply.
2. Two leaders (male & female) are to accompany the group in a ration of two leaders to each 10 youth.
3. Adults must occupy sleeping quarter at night.
4. Separate facilities for privacy must be provided for both males and females by the unit.
